Rescue Mission, Agencies Make Warm Space Available

The Frederick Rescue Mission Day Shelter for the Homeless opens in the Bread of Life Kitchen at 419 W. South St. on days when the temperature is at or below 32 degrees Fahrenheit. The shelter has been open for several days, said Arnold Farlow, executive director of the Frederick Rescue Mission.

“In the mornings, we are open after breakfast from 8 a.m. to noon,” he said. “Then, if necessary, we are open after lunch from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. We are also working with the Religious Coalition’s Cold Weather Shelter for overflow matters.”

The Alan P. Linton Cold Weather Shelter at 27 DeGrange St. will be opening at 5:30 p.m. starting tonight, and will operate through Jan. 7, as long as high temperatures are below freezing.
